# Children, Childhood and Youth (CCY)

The Children, Childhood and Youth program queries social and cultural constructions of young people from diverse local and global contexts across contemporary and historical periods. You will explore the experiences of children and youth, adopting a child- and youth-centered rights-based approach that recognizes young people as agents in their own cultures. This interdisciplinary program offers core courses in the program, experiential education opportunities, and facilitates access to child- and youth-related courses across the University.

A degree in Children, Childhood and Youth requires the completion of 120 Credits and is typically completed over four academic years. Your courses will consist of Major, General Education, and Elective Courses.
