Your Degree Pathway



A degree in Disaster and Emergency Management requires the completion of 90 Credits for a Bachelor's Degree (three years) or 120 Credits for an Honours Degree (four years). Your courses will consist of Major, General Education, and Elective Courses.

First Year

First year will introduce you to the university environment, provide you with introductory courses in Disaster and Emergency Management, Business and General Education, and allow options for you to study courses aligned with your own interests.

Third Year

Your third year in Disaster and Emergency Management will focus more on the critical concepts of the field and expanding on the fundamental knowledge.

In your fourth and final year, you will focus primarily on advanced courses in your field and other interests you have explored with elective courses.
