Your Degree Pathway



A degree in French Studies requires the completion of 90 Credits for a Bachelor's Degree (three years) or 120 Credits for an Honours Degree (four years). Your courses will consist of Major, General Education, and Elective Courses.



In your second year, you will continue your development of the fundamentals in French Studies.
