Your Degree Pathway



A degree in Jewish Studies requires the completion of 90 Credits for a Bachelor's Degree (three years) or 120 Credits for an Honours Degree (four years). Your courses will consist of Major, General Education, and Elective Courses.

First year will introduce you to the university environment, provide you with general education courses, and allow options for you to study courses aligned



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with your own interests.

Jewish Studies Courses: The Jewish Experience, Civilization and Culture, Hebrew Course General Education Courses: Humanities, Social Sciences or Natural Sciences (for non-science students) Elective Courses: Your choice of courses outside of Jewish Studies



In your second year, you will continue your development of the fundamentals in Jewish Studies.

Third Year


Your third year in Jewish Studies will allow you to explore specific interests in the field.
