

Your Degree Pathway

A degree in Linguistics requires the completion of 90 Credits for a Bachelor's Degree (three years) or 120 Credits for an Honours Degree (four years). Your courses will consist of Major, General Education, and Elective Courses.

First Year

First year will introduce you to the university environment, provide you with general education courses, and allow options for you to study courses aligned with your own interests.



Linguistics Courses: Introduction to Linguistics

General Education Courses: Humanities, Social Sciences or Natural Sciences (for non-science students)

Elective Courses: Your choice of courses outside of Linguistics

Second Year

In your second year, you will continue your development of the fundamentals in Linguistics.



Linguistics Courses: Phonetics, Phonology I: Analysis, Morphology I: Analysis, Syntax 1: Analysis

General Education Courses: Humanities, Social Sciences or Natural Sciences (for non-science students)

Elective Courses: Choose new subjects to explore or continue to develop skills from previous selections

Third Year

Your third year in Linguistics will allow you to explore specific interests in the field.



Linguistics Course Options: Phonology II: Theory, Syntax II: Theory + other 3000 or 4000 Level Linguistics courses for which you have the prerequisites

Elective Courses: Choose new subjects to explore or continue to develop skills from previous selections

Fourth Year

In your fourth and final year, your courses in Linguistics will be designed to meet your specific interests.



Linguistics Course Options: Any 4000 Level Linguistics courses for which you have the prerequisites

Elective Courses: These courses can include additional Linguistics courses or further courses of interest at the upper level
